

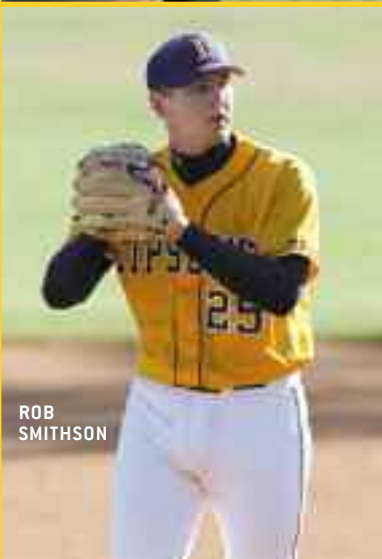

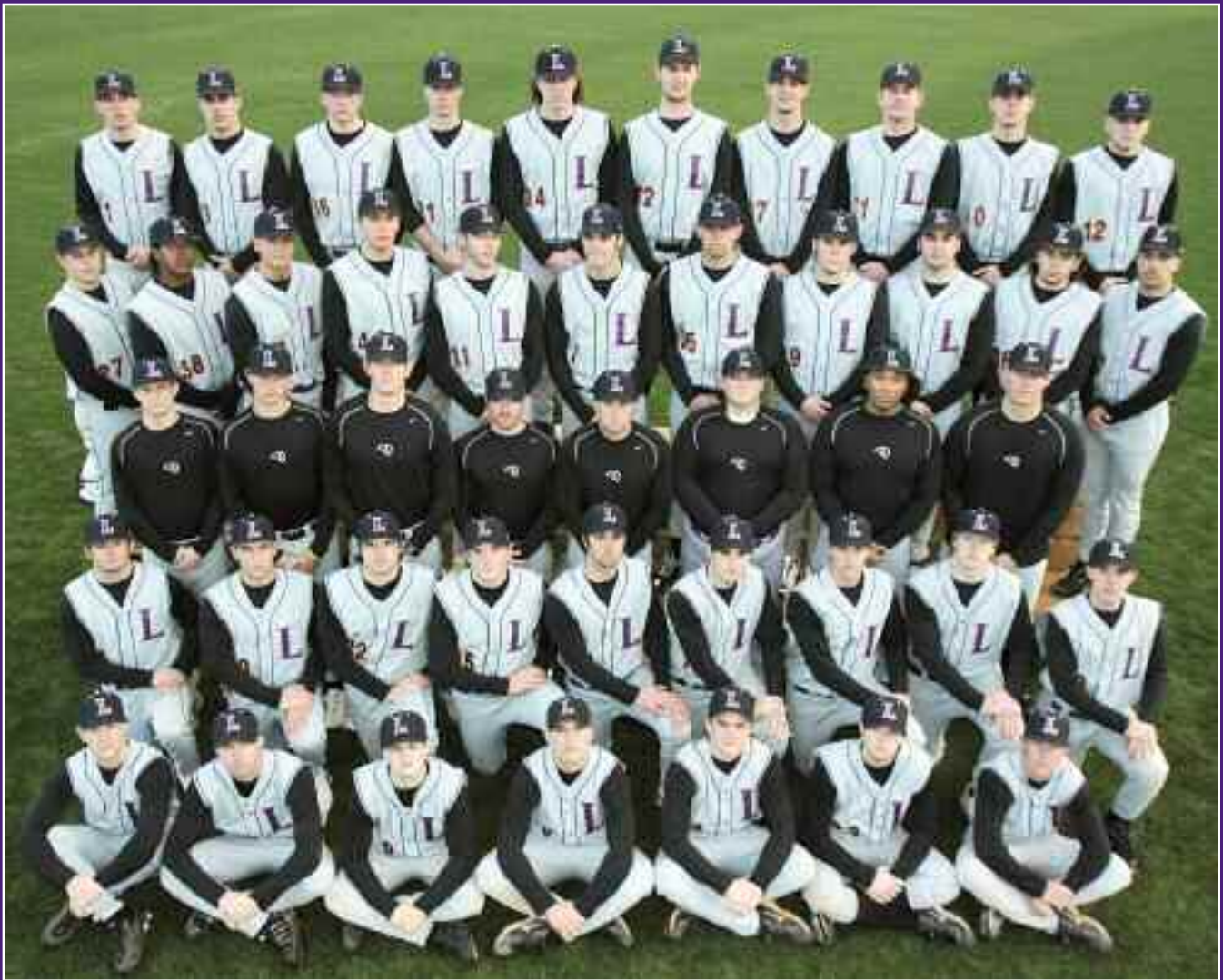

# Dugan Field

AND THE STEPHEN LEE MARSH STADIUM



**T**he Lipscomb baseball program opened up the current Dugan Field in 1991. The field is located along Granny White Pike and adjacent to Allen Arena. Ken Dugan coached the Bison Baseball team from 1960-1996, winning over 1000 games, including two NAIA championships.

On March 17, 2005, Lipscomb dedicated Stephen Lee Marsh Stadium at Ken Dugan Field. With the addition of stadium lights, night baseball came to the Lipscomb campus for the first time.



In the fall of 2007, the Lipscomb baseball field completed the most extensive renovation since it opened in 1991. Over \$50,000 was spent to upgrade the playing facility with the addition of a new artificial turf halo that surrounds the home plate area of Dugan Field. The turf halo measures 45 feet tall and 60 feet wide and displays a 12-foot Power "L" that is purple trimmed in

gold and black. A new 15-foot outfield-warning track was installed that circles the outfield fence and extends up the left field and right field foul lines.



# Strength & Conditioning

STATE-OF-THE-ART EQUIPMENT

**T**he 4,000-square foot athletics Strength and Conditioning facility opened in February of 2001 with the renovations to historic McQuiddy Gym. Featuring the latest in state-of-the-art equipment, this facility is a valued resource for the entire Lipscomb athletics program.

On the floor are four Power Lift Platforms, four Hammer Strength Benches, and four Hammer Strength Squat Racks. Equipment also includes



eight tons of Ivanko dumbbells (up to 125 lbs.) and Ivanko slotted easy grip plates. In addition to 40-plus Hammer Strength, Life Strength, and Life Fitness cardio equipment, this facility also houses brand new testing, speed, agility, and plyometric equipment. The flooring is Mondo Sport Impact.

The Strength and Conditioning facility is under the supervision of Athletics Strength Coach John Hudy.

## Dr. Randy Lowry

LIPSCOMB UNIVERSITY'S 17TH PRESIDENT

**D**r. Randy Lowry, founder of the nationally-recognized Straus Institute for Dispute Resolution and professor of law at Pepperdine University in Malibu, Calif., took office as Lipscomb University's 17th president Sept. 26, 2005.

A graduate of Pepperdine University, Lowry earned a bachelor's degree in political science and a master's degree in public administration from the Malibu, Calif. university. He received the juris doctor degree from Hamline University, in St. Paul, Minn. In 1986, Lowry joined the law school faculty at Pepperdine and established a new international academic program in the emerging field of dispute resolution. Through his work at the Straus Institute, Lowry has served churches and individuals in resolving church-related disputes. In addition to teaching at Pepperdine, Lowry has worked, literally, around the world. He is an annual visiting faculty member at Vermont Law School and City University of Hong Kong. He has also taught at Shantou University, in Beijing, China; Bond University in Gold Coast, Australia; Hamline University; and the University of Modena in



Modena, Italy. His consulting and training practice has included work for the legal community in The Netherlands, the introduction of mediation in India through a grant from the Asian Development Bank, training for judges in Buenos Aires, Argentina, as well as consultation with lawyers for Freshfields, an international law firm in Asia.

Dr. Lowry is a regular public speaker and has given keynote presentations at Bible lecture-ships and conferences including those at Faulkner University, Abilene Christian University, Harding University, Pepperdine University, Oklahoma Christian

University and Rochester College. He is the co-founder and first president of the Southern California Mediation Association, co-founder to the Ventura Center for Dispute Settlement, served as a gubernatorial appointment to the California Dispute Resolution Advisory Council, a member of the California Judicial Council's Task Force on the Quality of Justice as well as the California Supreme Court Blue Ribbon Committee on Arbitration Ethics.

## New Beginnings

LOOKING TOWARD NEW OFFENSE AND NEW COACH

**F**or the 2007 Lipscomb Bisons things have changed. With the loss of much of their 2006 starting lineup the Bisons will be forced to look toward their new recruits, many of whom are freshmen eagerly anticipating their first glimpse of NCAA Division I baseball.

In addition, Jeff Forehand will take over as head coach for the Bisons. The coaching staff will be rounded out with Brian Ryman's being named the new assistant coach, and Lantz Wheeler's returning as the pitching coach.

Returning as the starting catcher for the Bisons will be sophomore **Caleb Joseph**. Last season Joseph batted .265 with 35 hits and 22 RBIs in 45 games.

"Caleb is coming off a really good year and we anticipate him carrying the bulk of the load behind the plate," Forehand said.

Sophomore **Andrew Kincaid** and freshman **AJ Thomas** are also expected to see some playing time in the catcher's role.

"When we went through fall practice everybody made significant strides as far as who would occupy most of the time behind the plate," Forehand said. "But if we had to start tomorrow, Caleb would probably catch the majority of the innings with the others running close seconds."

The first base position will be one decided by pitching match-ups with right-handed hitter **Jared Picchiottino** and left-handed hitter **Justin Sanders** likely receiving the majority of the playing time. Freshman **Ryan Wilkins** is also expected to play a large role at first.

"Fortunately Jared is a right-handed hitter and Justin is a left-handed hitter which will give us a lot of options as we match up against different pitchers," Forehand said. "Also Ryan Wilkins has really been making some significant strides towards playing time at first base.

"With all three of those guys, whoever does not occupy the first base option will have great opportunity



to fill in for us at the designated hitter's role and also as a pinch hitter."

The Bisons will begin the season with four options at second base: **Clay Lehning**, **Kevin Nelson**, **Andrew Nickerson**, and **Kevin Gavigan**.

"They are all the same type player and they all have the same type build," Forehand said. "All of them have their quality that I feel like will be able to give us a dimension at second base, and all of them have a skill that they can do better than the others. So we will have to see how that shapes out at second base."

At shortstop, junior transfer **Ben Williams** is

expected to receive the majority of the starts.

"He is a good runner, good hitter, and a good defender," Forehand said. "We anticipate him being a big part of our middle infield."

In addition, sophomore **Branden Cadavid** will likely see some time at shortstop. Last season Cadavid batted .309 with 17 hits and 10 RBIs in 23 games.

"Branden might be considered our best infielder and best defender overall," Forehand said.

At third base, in addition to Cadavid, freshman **Donnie Amos** will be relied on heavily.

"Donnie came in as a very good high school player," Forehand said. "He will probably spend some time in left field as well. He is a very good hitter so if third or left is not an option, he could also see some time as the designated hitter."

Left field is another position which could be determined by pitching match-ups. **Eric Abend**, a right-handed hitter, and **Allen Bolden**, a left-handed hitter, are expected to see the majority of the playing time.

In centerfield, senior transfer **Casey Bond** is expected to receive most of the starts.

"He will be a big part of our lineup and probably stabilize centerfield for us," Forehand said.

Junior transfer **Shane Simpkins** is expected to receive a great deal of the playing time in right field. The Bisons



also expect Simpkins to be a big offensive force for the team this season as well.

**Michael Fahs, Dallas Crouch, Tyler Courson, and Cody Morris** will also see some playing time in the outfield for the Bisons this season.

On the mound, **Matt Schnelly** will once again be looked towards to lead a young staff. Schnelly, a senior right-hander, led the team in innings pitched (96) and strikeouts (91) last season. Schnelly was also second on the team in ERA (4.88) and opposing batting average (.276). After pitching a complete game shut-out against a talented Pittsburgh lineup last season, Schnelly became the Bisons' first player ever to be named Atlantic Sun Pitcher of the Week.

"Matt is going to anchor our pitching staff," Forehand said. "He was a big part of the team last year and he only continues to get better. We look for him to chew up a lot of innings for us on the weekend."

In addition to Schnelly, junior **Paul Piennette** will likely return as a conference starter this season.

"Paul made some quality starts last year and I look forward to him doing the same thing this year," Forehand said.

The final conference starter is expected to be senior transfer **John King**. King is a 6'3" right-hander from Peachtree City, Georgia.



Several pitchers are expected to see time as a mid-week starter, with senior **Rob Smithson** being one of them. In 17 appearances last season, Smithson was 4-2 with a 6.85 ERA.

"Smithson is another senior that can add some experience," Forehand said. "We don't know what his role will be as we start the season, but he will either be a starter or reliever for us and can add some experience and depth."

Despite such a large pitching staff, every pitcher is expected to be relied heavily upon in some capacity over the season. With such a large group of freshman pitchers, the success of the Bisons bullpen will reflect in large part the ability of the younger and less experienced freshmen to handle the pressure.

Freshman pitchers include right-handers **Matt Bowling, Taylor Merry** and **Dylan Ray**, and left-hander **Rex Brothers**. Sophomores **Josh Spicer, Jerry Young, Mike Zenko, Charles Williams**, and **Brandon McClurg** will be joined by upper-classmen **Chris Burnett, Sean Szymanski**, and **James Ogden**.

The closer's role is expected to look much like it did last year, with sophomores Williams and McClurg likely to play a large role.

"McClurg and Williams will be a huge part of our bullpen," Forehand said. "Both of those guys are solid, solid pitchers coming out of the bullpen for us and can provide some quality innings for us."

The Lipscomb baseball scene has certainly changed. Equipped with a new coach, numerous pitching recruits, and a drastically altered lineup the Bisons are confident that their place in the conference standings will improve also.

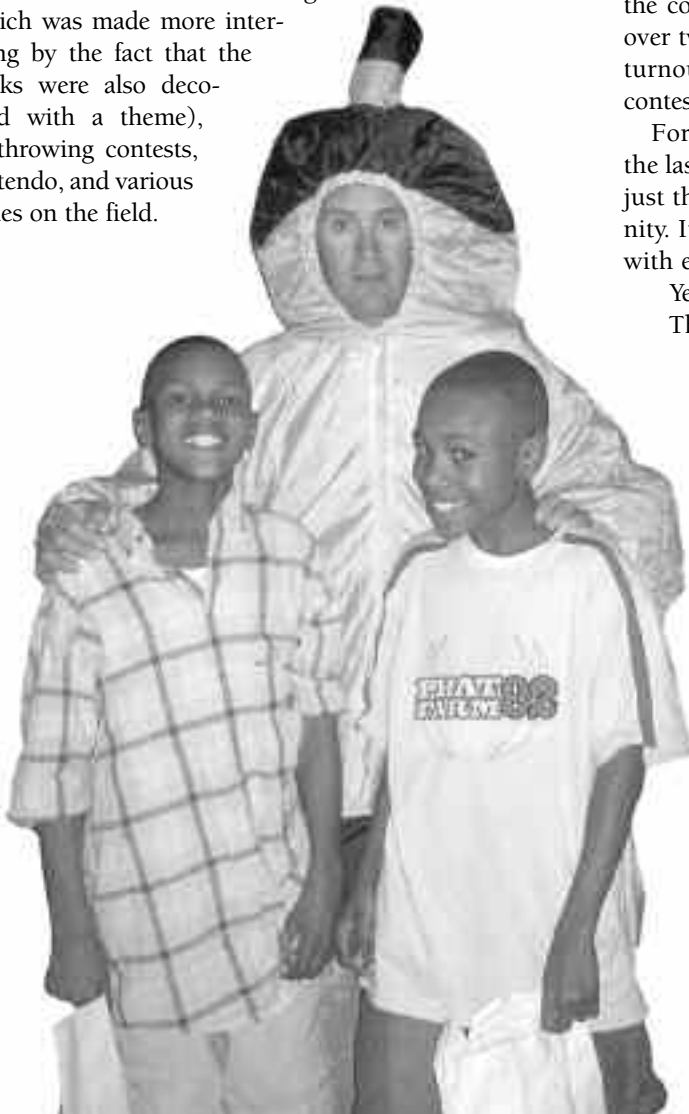

## Leading by Example

WITH PLAYERS



**T**homas Fuller once said, "A good example is the best sermon." Albert Einstein said, "Setting an example is not the main means of influencing another. It is the only means."

"He is not asking us to do anything that he wouldn't do. He is out there doing every single push up, every single lunge, and every single sprint."

As simple as it may seem, it was a powerful gesture. Through his actions, Forehand not only gained the respect of his players, but demonstrated his respect for them. By placing himself at his players' level, he succeeded in inspiring his team with his efforts, encouraging them to train harder.

"It makes you work that much harder, and it made it more worthwhile," Joseph said. "You really feel like you've accomplished something when you are out there working alongside your coach. It is absolutely amazing. I get so excited, it makes me work that much harder, and go all out everyday."

"It shows his level of commitment to the team. By being out there he is showing us that he is 100 percent committed, and we are going to follow him and hopefully get this program back on the map."

Whether he intended it or not, Forehand's actions united him with his new team. For those who knew little of their new coach on the first day of workouts, they witnessed a man who respected them enough to sweat with them. Because they witnessed their coach's respect, he earned theirs.



## HEAD COACH

### Jeff Forehand



Jeff Forehand is starting his second head coaching job on the collegiate level in the same town.

Forehand, the former head baseball coach at Trevecca Nazarene University, an NAIA school in Nashville, is the new head coach of Lipscomb University.

Forehand replaces Wynn Fletcher, who resigned after six seasons with the Bisons. The Bisons are an NCAA Division I program competing in the Atlantic Sun Conference.

“Jeff Forehand is a great fit for Lipscomb,” said Athletic Director Steve Potts. “He identifies strongly with our Christian mission. He has had great success everywhere he has been on both the high school and collegiate level. We are very excited about Jeff leading our baseball program.”

Forehand becomes the 16th baseball coach in Lipscomb history. He coached the past six seasons at Trevecca, compiling a 211-142-1 record. This past season Trevecca was 42-20 after winning both the TranSouth Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships in 2005 with a 46-17 record. In 2004 Trevecca was 44-17-1.

In 2004 he was named NAIA Region XI Coach of the Year and TranSouth Conference Coach of the Year. He was also named TranSouth Conference Coach of the Year in 2005.

Off of the field the Trevecca program has also excelled with the team grade point average increasing by half a point during his tenure.

Forehand, a Nashville native, also guided Goodpasture Christian School to three state titles in 1995, 1997 and 1999 in his eight seasons as head coach. He was also named State Coach of the Year three times.

Forehand served as an assistant coach from 1990-92 with his father, Fred, at Montgomery Bell Academy. He played college baseball at Belmont University. He also holds a Masters of Education degree from Tennessee State University. Jeff and his wife, Karen, have two sons, Gant and Brooks. They live in Nashville.

### Brian Ryman



After serving as the Director of Baseball Operations in 2006, Brian Ryman is beginning his first season as the Bisons assistant baseball coach in 2007.

“To me being a Lipscomb coach means you get a chance to work with some of the greatest people the world has to offer,” Ryman said. “Baseball is just a game in the grand scheme of things. If I can help these guys be classy, respectful, and hardworking gentlemen both on and off the field, then there is no way that they can’t have very success-filled lives.”

Ryman was born on May 30, 1980, and is a graduate of Jefferson County High School. Ryman attended Hiwassee College in Madisonville, Tenn., where he pitched for the baseball team and was a member of Who’s Who Among American College Students. Ryman spent the next four years as a student assistant at the University of Tennessee. “Lipscomb has the potential to be a national powerhouse,” Ryman said. “This won’t happen overnight, but I do believe that Dr. Lowry and Dr. Potts have laid a foundation in all academic and athletic areas to make it happen! I have been to a lot of schools and Lipscomb is definitely on its way.”

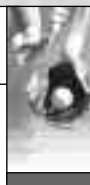

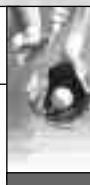

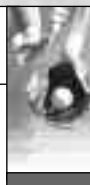

# Bisons Hall of Fame—Baseball

## Mel Brown 1989, Athlete

Coach Brown attended Lipscomb between 1962 and 1966. He lettered four years in baseball and was the only senior on the 1966 team that won the first baseball district championship for Lipscomb. Mel never hit below .300 while playing for the Bisons. After leaving Lipscomb, he became a teacher and coach in the Nashville Metro School System and is presently the baseball coach at McGavock High School where he has guided his teams to numerous district and regional titles along with three state championships. Coach Brown is well respected in the baseball community and has won over 500 games during his years at McGavock. He has helped the Bison baseball program in gigantic proportions by feeding to Lipscomb some of the greatest players to ever wear a Bison uniform.

## Mary Hall Carrigan 2002, Meritorious Service

Mary Carrigan has served the Lipscomb community for nearly 46 years. Since her arrival on campus as a student in 1953, Mary has devoted her life to making Lipscomb a better place. Mary graduated from Lipscomb in 1958 and continued to work as secretary in the business office for the next 16 years. Since 1977, Mary has served Lipscomb athletics in several different capacities, including secretary for the Director of Athletics, Bison Baseball secretary and secretary for the Department of Physical Education (Kinesiology). During Mary's tenure she has been directly involved in every facet of Lipscomb athletics. Her close work with the Bison Club, eligibility and Lipscomb's student-athletes was instrumental in developing a successful athletic department. Over the years Mary and her family traveled great distances to show their support for Lipscomb Athletics. Mary Carrigan will always be remembered for her service, dedication and devotion to Lipscomb Athletics and helping create a standard of excellence.

## Jerry Dugan 1998, Athlete

Jerry Dugan played baseball at Lipscomb from 1956-1960. In 1960 Jerry served as Captain of the Bison baseball team and was ranked among the nation's elite in stolen bases. After leaving Lipscomb, Jerry coached at Hazel-Green High School from 1961-1967, where he captured the Alabama State Championship in 1967. From 1967 until his retirement in 1998 Jerry coached at Lee High School, where in 1968 he captured a second Alabama State Basketball Championship. During his coaching career, Jerry would win an amazing 610 games. Over the years Jerry has been honored for his accomplishments by being named to the Alabama Madison County Hall of Fame, Alabama High School Sports Hall of Fame, and

Huntsville Athletic Booster Hall of Fame. The ultimate honor came when Jerry captured his 600th career win and Lee High School renamed their gymnasium "Dugan Hall", in Jerry's honor. Jerry, along with his brother Ken Dugan, are considered two of the most successful brother coaches in sports history. Jerry Dugan, a former successful Lipscomb athlete who obtained the ultimate success in sports history.

## Kenneth L. Dugan 1987, Athlete/Coach

Ken Dugan was an outstanding baseball player for Lipscomb. In 1956 he hit .456, a record that still stands in 1987. Since 1960, he has served as Lipscomb's head baseball coach. His teams won NAIA national championships in 1977 and 1979. In 1984, Coach Dugan was inducted into the NAIA Baseball Hall of Fame. During his twenty-eight years at Lipscomb, Dugan has compiled over 850 victories, making him second among active NAIA coaches in number of wins.

## Steve Fletcher 1997, Athlete

Steve Fletcher decided on David Lipscomb College after being named Arkansas High School Baseball Player of the Year in 1973. Steve graduated from Lipscomb in 1977 after a brilliant career both as a hitter and pitcher. In 1977, Steve led the Lipscomb baseball team as the Bisons captured the 21st annual NAIA National Championship in St. Joseph, Missouri. The title was Lipscomb's first-ever National Championship. After hitting an amazing .500 and pitching in three different tournament games, including earning the save in the championship game, Steve was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. That season the Bisons established a new school record after winning 47 games. During Steve's career the Bisons averaged an amazing 45 wins a season. Since leaving Lipscomb Steve has continued to be a leader, experiencing the same success in the business world, serving in management for a Fortune 500 company. Steve Fletcher will always be known for leading Lipscomb to their first National Championship and putting Lipscomb athletics on the map.

## Bob Hamilton 2002, Athlete

Bob Hamilton played baseball for David Lipscomb from 1975-1978. Bob is considered one of the greatest players to ever play in the Lipscomb baseball program. Named team MVP in 1977, he led the Bisons to the NAIA national championship. In 1975, and again in 1978, Bob was named first team NAIA All-American. During his career Bob led the Bisons to an amazing 184 wins in four years. In 1978, he helped lead Lipscomb to a school record 50 wins. Throughout his career Bob hit an impres-

sive .370 including a team batting average of .389 in 1975 and .398 in 1977. Bob, an outstanding outfielder, finished with an impressive .975 career fielding percentage. In 1976 Bob was selected to be a member of the All-USA team that participated in the World Games in Mexico. After his career in 1978, Bob signed with the Cincinnati Reds. Bob Hamilton will always be considered one of the greatest players in Lipscomb Baseball history.

## Ted D. Jamison 1997, Athlete

Ted Jamison played baseball at Lipscomb from 1969-1972. Ted wasted little time making an immediate impact on the Bison Baseball program, as he broke the school single season record for stolen bases during his freshman season. During Ted's career he would also break single season records for hits (79) and runs scored (64). Ted would also break his single season stolen base record during his junior year when he finished with 39 stolen bases, a record that still stands to date. With Ted leading the way, the Bisons would experience the greatest success in school history, where they would finish in second place. The Miracle Bisons would again advance to the National Tournament in 1972 and for the second straight year finish in second place. Ted was named to the NAIA National All-Tournament team in 1971 and in 1972 at the National Championship he was presented with the Coaches Hustle Award. Since leaving Lipscomb, Ted has been just as successful in business serving as an Executive Vice President in the Telecommunications Industry. Ted Jamison is considered by many one of the greatest players to ever wear a Bison uniform and will always be a member of the Miracle Bisons.

## Kal Koenig 1998, Athlete

Kal Koenig attended David Lipscomb College from 1978-1981, where he was an outstanding pitcher for the Bison baseball program. During his career he helped lead the Bisons to the NAIA National Tournament in each of his four seasons. In 1979, Kal and the Bisons won the NAIA World Series here in Nashville, with Kal being voted the tournament's Most Valuable Player. During his career the Bison baseball program was one of the most dominant programs in the country, averaging an amazing 45 wins a season, including two 50 win seasons in 1978 and 1981. In 1981, Kal was voted All-Conference, All-District, All-Area and 1st Team NAIA All-American. Since leaving Lipscomb Kal has been just as successful in his family life, and serving his fellow man as a firefighter in New Orleans, Louisiana. Kal Koenig, a player who was one of the all-time great relief pitchers for Lipscomb who now imitates his baseball career with his professional career.



## Steve Liddle

1994, Athlete

Steve Liddle played baseball for Lipscomb from 1978-81 where he was an outstanding catcher. During Steve's career he led the Lipscomb baseball program to the NAIA National Tournament four straight seasons. In 1979 Steve and the Bisons captured the NAIA National Championship that was played in Nashville, with Steve being named to the World Series All-Tournament team. During Steve's four-year career with Lipscomb he led the Bison program to an amazing 179 wins including 50 wins in 1978 and 51 wins in 1981. For Steve's efforts he was named All-District 24 in 1979, 1980 and in 1981. Steve signed with the California Angels organization where he played for nearly seven seasons. Since finishing his playing career Steve has been a very successful minor league manager for several teams in the Minnesota Twins organization. Steve Liddle will always be remembered as a true winner and one of the greatest catchers to wear a Lipscomb uniform.

## Lee Marsh

1998, Meritorious Service

Lee Marsh attended David Lipscomb College from 1946-1949. Ever since his school days the love that Lee has for Lipscomb Athletics has been at the center of his life. After leaving Lipscomb as a student Lee would experience tremendous success in the business world, all the while being an active supporter of David Lipscomb. Lee Marsh is considered an extremely successful Christian business leader, having succeeded in Banking, the Automobile Industry, Land Development and the printing business. In his giving back to Lipscomb, Lee has served as Past President of the Lipscomb Alumni Association, Charter Member of the Lipscomb Development Council, Charter Member and Officer of the Bison Booster Club and was founder of the James R. Byers Award, given each year to the top Lipscomb Athlete. Lee has also served on the Lipscomb Board of Directors since 1978 where for the past 17 years he has served as the board's secretary-treasurer. Lee Marsh, a Christian man who has given to David Lipscomb University with his means, time and presence.

## Michael "Bo" McLaughlin

1991, Athlete

Bo played baseball for Lipscomb University from 1972-1975. Considered one of the most dominant pitchers to ever wear a Bison uniform, Bo still holds Lipscomb pitching records for the most strikeouts in a game (19), along with most innings pitched (1412/3), and games won in a season (16). During Bo's career, he had three consecutive games in which he struck out 17, 18, and 19 batters. In 1975, Bo was drafted in the first round by the Houston Astros. Besides playing for Houston, Bo also played in the major leagues with the Atlanta Braves and the Oakland Athletics.

Since finishing his baseball career, Bo has directed his very successful baseball camps in Arizona. During the 1970's, Lipscomb University had one of college baseball's top programs. Fans filled Onion Dell to watch the Bison baseball team take the field and an outstanding pitcher by the name of Bo McLaughlin dominate opposing batters.

## Charles M. Morris

1991, Coach

Charles coached at Lipscomb University from 1955-1966. While at Lipscomb, he served as Head Coach for Men's Basketball, Baseball, Track and Tennis along with serving as Coordinator of Athletics. In 1969, Charles joined the staff of the national office of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. Charles worked at the NAIA offices in several different capacities and was one of the association's top leaders until his retirement in January of 1991. Charles was inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame in the Meritorious Services category, after being associated with the NAIA for nearly forty years and being a member of the NAIA staff for over twenty years. Charles Morris will always be considered one of the NAIA's great leaders after getting his start at Lipscomb University.

## Robert G. Neil

1988, Coach

Bob Neil played basketball and baseball at Lipscomb in the late 1920's. While at Harding College he was asked to return to Lipscomb to direct the athletic program here. During his ten years at the helm of the Lipscomb program he coached basketball, baseball, and tennis. Coach Neil later became a leader in public education in Nashville, and has always been an ambassador for Lipscomb through the years.

## Farrell Owens

1992, Athlete/Meritorious Service

Farrell graduated from Lipscomb University in 1968 after playing for the Bison baseball program for four seasons. Farrell was an outstanding outfielder, having even once turned an unassisted double play that made national news. Farrell also doubled in the winning run that gave Lipscomb its first baseball District Championship in 1966. He was one of Nashville's top summer league baseball players and was the youngest person to be inducted into the Nashville Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 1977. After leaving Lipscomb, Farrell was a key figure in bringing professional baseball to Nashville, serving as Vice-President General Manager and part owner of the Nashville Sounds. Over the years Farrell has also been a great supporter of Lipscomb athletics, being a charter member of the Bison Booster Club and serving as the club's President in 1985 and 1986. Farrell Owens was truly a team player on the field and continues as one with his support of Lipscomb University Athletics.

## Tim Pardue

1994, Athlete

Tim Pardue played baseball for Lipscomb from 1976-1979. While at Lipscomb Tim was an outstanding pitcher and led the Bison baseball program to the NAIA National Tournament on three different occasions. In 1977 and 1979 the Bisons won the NAIA National Championship with the help of Tim's outstanding pitching performances. Ironically, Tim was the winning pitcher in each of the championship games. To date Tim still holds the Bison win-loss record for his perfect 12-0 season in 1977. Tim was also chosen Most Valuable Collegiate Player in the city of Nashville for his efforts in 1977. In 1978 Tim was one of the few players selected to tour Korea and Taiwan with Team USA. Tim finished his pitching career with an impressive overall record of 40 wins and only 5 losses. Tim was drafted in 1979 by the Boston Red Sox organization, but opted to enter the business world where he has been just as successful. Tim currently serves as president of Coronado Products. Tim Pardue will always be remembered as one of the great pitchers in Bison Baseball history.

## Bob Parsons

1989, Athlete

Bob Parsons played baseball for David Lipscomb from 1975-1978. During his outstanding career Bob established himself as one of the greatest players to ever wear a Lipscomb baseball uniform. Bob was named team MVP in both 1976 and in 1978. In 1978 Bob was named first team NAIA All-American. During his career Bob led the Bisons to an amazing 184 wins in four years, including the 1977 NAIA National Championship. Bob was named to the NAIA National All-Tournament team in both 1977 and again in 1978. In 1978, Bob, who served as team captain, helped lead Lipscomb to a school record 50 wins and also teamed up from his second base position to set a school record 60 double plays. That same season Bob set a school record for hits in a season with 99, while hitting an impressive .402 on the season. During his career Bob hit .364 leading the team in hits in 1976 and again in 1978. Bob was also an outstanding infielder finishing with a .975 career fielding percentage. After his career at Lipscomb in 1978, Bob signed with the Pittsburgh Pirates. Bob Parsons, one of the all time greats in Lipscomb baseball history.

## Herschel J. Priestley

1987, Coach

Coach Priestley served as the first inter-scholastic coach at David Lipscomb College. After attending college at Lipscomb he spent three years as a coach. He was also an outstanding athlete for the school, scoring the first basket ever scored in Burton Gym during an official game.





## Michael T. Santi

**1989, Athlete**

Mike played baseball at Lipscomb between 1971 and 1974. He was a member of the 1971 and 1972 teams that were runners-up in the NAIA World series and the 1974 team that returned to the national tournament. As a shortstop, he was the MVP of the '71 team and an All-District, All-Area and honorable mention All-American that season. He was captain of the team in 1972 and 1973. He graduated cum laude in 1974 and went on to medical school at the University of Tennessee. He was president of his 1979 medical school class. Mike will always be remembered for being one of the top Bison baseball players who helped put Lipscomb on the map.

## John David Scobey

**1990, Athlete**

David attended Lipscomb in the early 1940's and played basketball, baseball, and tennis. While he was at Lipscomb the campus opinion in the early 40's gave him the first claim to the title "Lipscomb's Greatest Athlete". He was twice All-Mississippi Valley Conference in basketball, twice intramural cup winner for accumulating the most intramural points, captain of the 1942 baseball and basketball teams and at the time he was the all-time Lipscomb scoring average leader in basketball. In baseball, David hit .318 his senior season of playing for Lipscomb Hall of Famer Bob Neil. David was also an outstanding student having earned "cum laude" when graduating. After leaving Lipscomb, David became well known to the Nashville community for his work as Vice Mayor with the Metro Council. Whenever the great athletes of Lipscomb University are discussed, David Scobey's name is sure to be brought up.

## Elvis C. Sherrill

**1990, Athlete**

Elvis played basketball and baseball for Lipscomb between 1948-1952. His senior year he was a member of the Volunteer-State Athletic Conference All-Tournament Basketball team. After playing at Lipscomb he coached basketball and baseball at the college between 1952 and 1955 and later coached at Lipscomb High School between 1958 and 1961. After leaving Lipscomb, Elvis joined the FBI in 1962, where he worked until retiring in 1982. Elvis Sherrill will be remembered for his success as an athlete and coach and for his great career after his days at Lipscomb.

## Ernie Smith

**1999, Athlete/Meritorious Service**

Ernie Smith attended David Lipscomb College from 1969-1973, where he was part of the Lipscomb baseball program that advanced to the school's first ever NAIA National baseball tournament. During Ernie's career, the Bison baseball program won 143 games and advance to the NAIA National Tournament in 1971 and again in 1972. After graduation, Ernie began his long career with David

Lipscomb High School where he is considered one of Tennessee's most successful high school coaches. Ernie will always be one of the few coaches in Tennessee sports history to win 500 games as girls' basketball coach and 500 games as baseball coach. Ernie directed Lipscomb to the TSSAA girls' state basketball championship in 1986 and won TSSAA baseball championships in 1978, 1982, 1986, and 1998. Ernie Smith will always be considered one of the most successful Lipscomb graduates, not just because of his winning abilities, but the impact he has made on so many young people's lives.

## Chris Snoddy

**2004, Meritorious Service**

In 14 years as an athletic trainer at Lipscomb University, Chris Snoddy treated physical ailments of student-athletes while dispensing a word of encouragement. From 1977-81, Chris worked as a student trainer. After finishing his degree he joined the athletics department as a full-time athletic trainer, a position he held until 1991. He was a leading pioneer in the development of the sports medicine program. During his tenure he worked with the 1979 NAIA National Champion baseball team and the 1986 NAIA National Championship basketball team. He was instrumental in the construction of a new men's locker room, a new athletic training facility in 1983, and the design and construction of the Allen Arena Sports Medicine facility. Chris also showed his support by serving as president of the Bison Booster Club for three years. He now works as an athletic trainer in Nashville and continues to provide valuable support for Lipscomb Athletics.

## Butch Stinson

**1988, Athlete**

In the early 70's Butch helped Coach Dugan build a nationally recognized baseball program. In 1971 Butch was named to the NAIA All-American second team. In 1972 he became the first Lipscomb baseball player to be named first-team All-American, an honor which he achieved again in 1973. He was on the 1971 and 1972 teams that finished second both years in the World Series, the first NAIA teams ever to accomplish this feat on their first two appearances. Butch holds the school records for lowest season (0.91) and the most strikeouts in a season (196). He went on to play professional baseball in the Chicago White Sox organization.

## Axel W. Swang

**1997, Coach/Meritorious Service**

Axel Swang worked at Lipscomb University from 1947 until his retirement in 1992. Besides his dedication as one of the most respected faculty members in Lipscomb history, Axel served as Head Baseball Coach for Lipscomb High School before taking over the Bison baseball program for the 1952 season. As always Axel was there to help his school out and ended the season on a successful note leading the Bisons to the

VSAC Western Division Championship. Axel served as a Chairman of the Lipscomb Business Department from 1948-1992. One of the highlights of Axel's career came in 1984 when Lipscomb University honored him by naming the school's new business building the Swang Business Center. In 1995 Axel was also honored by the Tennessee Society of Certified Public Accountants as he received the highest honor with a Lifetime Achievement Award. Axel has also served as a member of the Lipscomb Athletic Hall of Fame Committee and served as an officer in the Bison Booster Club. While Axel has spent almost his entire life serving the Lipscomb students he still has devoted his time to God serving as an Elder and preacher in the church. Axel Swang will always be remembered for his dedication to Lipscomb and his example of integrity.

## Walter Ward

**2004, Athlete**

Walter Ward was a pivotal player in Lipscomb's second NAIA National Championship in baseball in 1979. Ward played shortstop for the Bisons from 1977-81 and posted a career .364 batting average with 45 doubles, 36 home runs, and 191 runs batted in. During his college career the Bisons also won four district and four area championships. Walter also attended Georgia Tech for postgraduate work in the field of chemical engineering. He owns Rabey Utilities, based in Savannah, GA, which provides international construction and consulting work. Walter Ward and the 1979 Bisons baseball team will always have a special place in the history of Lipscomb Athletics.

## Reggie Whittemore

**1999, Athlete**

Reggie Whittemore played baseball for David Lipscomb College from 1976-1979. During Reggie's career the Bisons averaged an amazing 45 wins a year, as he led the Bisons to NAIA National Championships in 1977 and 1979. During his career Reggie totaled 41 home runs, 174 RBIs and had a career batting average of .339. Reggie's career slugging percentage was an impressive .668, establishing himself as one of the greatest hitters to ever wear a Lipscomb uniform. After finishing his career at Lipscomb, Reggie was drafted by the Boston Red Sox organization where he played professionally for ten seasons. Since returning to Nashville, Reggie has devoted his time to helping inner city children, directing the softball and baseball programs for the Boys and Girls Club of Nashville. Reggie "Rock" Whittemore will always be remembered as one of the greatest sluggers in Lipscomb baseball history.

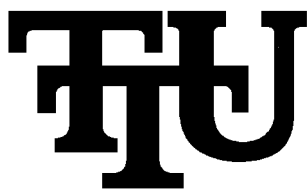

## HISTORY

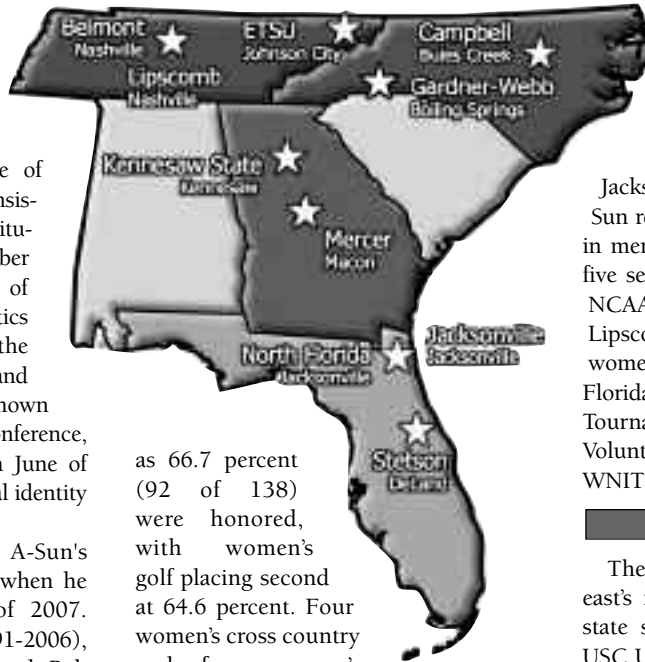
Founded September 19, 1978, the Atlantic Sun Conference has operated over a quarter century in the ever-changing landscape of intercollegiate athletics with a consistent commitment to its Constitutional Mission to "assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports." Formerly known as the Trans America Athletic Conference, the A-Sun changed its name in June of 2001 and introduced a new visual identity that distinguishes the league.

Ted Gumbart became the A-Sun's fourth full-time commissioner when he took the reins in January of 2007. Gumbart followed Bill Bibb (1991-2006), Lou McCullough (1983-91) and Bob Vanatta (1979-83). The A-Sun office has been in Macon, Georgia, since April, 1992, after relocating from Athens, Georgia (1983-1992). The first office was located in Shreveport, Louisiana (1979-1983). Academic Excellence

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Atlantic Sun Conference continues to prove that it excels both athletically and academically. In 2005-06, more than 50 percent of the conference's student-athletes who participated during the season earned all-academic honors. For the spring season alone, 52.2 percent of student-athletes in the A-Sun were honored, as compared to 50.0 percent during the fall, giving the conference a 51.4 percent total.

This marks the third consecutive year that the A-Sun has surpassed the 50 percent total. Belmont University won the A-Sun All-Academic Trophy for the fifth consecutive year. The award is given annually to the conference school with the greatest percentage of student-athletes receiving all academic honors. The Nashville school finished with 65.1 percent of all student-athletes earning the honor. For the fourth consecutive year, women's cross country had the highest rate of student-athletes earn all-academic,



as 66.7 percent (92 of 138) were honored, with women's golf placing second at 64.6 percent. Four women's cross country and four women's soccer teams received All-Academic national recognition from their respective coaches associations.

Mercer's Will Emerson earned A-Sun Student-Athlete of the Year for the second consecutive year and academic All-America on the men's basketball first team. On the women's side, ETSU women's soccer standout Erin Ashton was voted A-Sun Student-Athlete of the Year. Both received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

The bar for academic excellence in the league was set in 2003-04 as Belmont broke its own single-season conference mark with 71.4% of its athletes earning All-Academic honors (152 of 213). A record 52.8 percent of all A-Sun athletes earned all-academic honors that year.

## ATHLETIC EXCELLENCE

The A-Sun has continually matched its classroom achievement with success on the playing fields. Over the past eight-plus years, the A-Sun has posted NCAA wins in each of the team sports that it sponsors. For the seventh straight season the A-Sun advanced multiple teams to the NCAA Baseball Championship, with tournament champion Stetson and regular season champion Jacksonville receiving bids in 2006. The A-Sun also

sent multiple teams to the NCAA men's golf championship for the fourth straight season in 2006 as Top-15 ranked ETSU joined A-Sun champ Jacksonville at NCAA Regionals. The A-Sun received multiple postseason berths in men's basketball for the third time in five seasons as Belmont made their first NCAA Championship appearance and Lipscomb earned an NIT bid. The women's programs matched the men as Florida Atlantic faced LSU in the NCAA Tournament and Belmont traveled to Volunteer State rival Tennessee Tech for a WNIT game.

## MEMBERSHIP

The A-Sun is a blend of the southeast's finest private and most dynamic state schools. Florida Gulf Coast and USC Upstate will enter league competition in 2007-08.

With outstanding achievement in academics and athletics, the A-Sun ranks as one of the country's top all-around collegiate athletic conferences. In addition to great schools, the A-Sun boasts some of the nation's top destination areas and media markets.
